ADVISORY

Following the recent issuance of the IATF-EID putting the NCR under alert level 4 on the new Community Quarantine Classification System, the National Museum of the Philippines Complex in Manila, including the National Planetarium will remain closed to the public until further notice.

Furthermore, the following regional, area and site museums are temporarily closed to the public due to government-imposed quarantine status or repairs:

- NM Ilocos Regional Museum Complex (Vigan City, Ilocos Sur)
- NM Cordillera Rice Terraces Regional Museum (Kiangan, Ifugao) until further notice
- NM Kabayan Burial Caves Site Museum (Kabayan, Benguet)
- NM Angono-Binangonan Petroglyphs Site Museum, (Binangonan, Rizal)
- NM Bicol Regional Museum (Daraga, Albay)
- NM Western Visayas Regional Museum (Jaro, Iloilo City)
- NMP-Eastern Northern Mindanao (Doongan, Butuan City)
- NM Bohol Area Museum (Tagbilaran City, Bohol) temporarily closed until Sept. 20, 2021

On the other hand, the following regional, area and site museums remain open to the public, with COVID prevention protocols strictly observed:

- NM Batanes Area Museum (Uyugan, Batanes)
- NM Cagayan Valley Regional Museum (Peñablanca, Cagayan)
- NM Tabon Cave Site Museum (Quezon, Palawan) open to local tourists within Palawan only
- NM Marinduque-Romblon Area Museum (Boac, Marinduque)
- NM Western-Southern Mindanao (Sta. Barbara, Zamboanga City)
- NM Sulu Archipelago Museum (Jolo, Sulu)
